## **VOCABULARY**

- 1. a **hen**: a female chicken. But the female of any bird can be referred to as a hen. An egg-laying hen is a hen raised for its eggs not for its meat.
- 2. a slaughterhouse: a place where animals are killed for their meat.
- 3. a **pen**: small area with a fence round it in which farm animals are kept.
- 4. **intensive farming**: to produce as many animals as possible from your land in a short time, usually with the aid of chemicals.
- 5. **factory farming**: system of farming which involves keeping animals indoors, often with very little space, and giving them special foods so that they grow more quickly or produce more eggs and milk.
- 6. **broiler chickens** are reared for meat rather than for eggs.
- 7. to cram: to put things or people into a container or place although there is hardly enough room for them.
- 8. crowded: full of people.
- 9. to collapse: if something collapses, it fails or comes to an end completely and suddenly.
- 10. a **cripple**: someone with a physical disability or a serious permanent injury, so serious that they can never move their body properly again.
- 11. **free-range**: system of keeping animals in which they can move and feed freely on an area of open ground.
- 12. to ban: to state officially that something must not be done, shown, or used.
- 13. a **shed**: large building used for storing things.
- 14. a **sow** is an adult female pig.
- 15. a **piglet** is a young pig.
- 16. **to rear**: to rear a young animal means you keep and look after it until it's old enough to be used for work or food, or until it can look after itself.
- 17. cattle are cows and bulls.
- 18. **dairy**: refers to foods such as butter and cheese that are made from milk. A dairy cow is used to produce milk rather than meat.
- 19. **organic**: methods of farming and gardening that use only natural animal and plant products to help the plants or animals grow and be healthy, rather than using chemicals.
- 20. a **crate**: large box used for transporting or storing things.
- 21.a calf/calves: young cow.
- 22. welfare: health, comfort, and happiness.
